We've been looking forward to Monday, July 17th, and the day is almost here! The statue of Our Lady of Fatima, which is touring the US in honor of the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady at Fatima, will be at St. Anthony's starting at 9 am. We are truly blessed to be among the parishes in the country to host this extraordinary event. Bishop Daly will join us at 5:30 pm as the principal celebrant at Mass. Please do plan to attend; you will be glad you did!

Sister Leslie and Sister Nancy, two of our St. Anthony parishioners and members of our choir, are Carmelite Sisters. This Sunday, July 16th, the Carmelite Order celebrates a Solemnity: the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

There is a marvelous connection between Our Lady of Fatima and Our Lady of Mount Carmel, one that Sr. Leslie and Sr. Nancy told me about. Here goes: Mary's last appearance at Lourdes was on July 16, 1858, which is the Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. During Mary's final apparition at Fatima, on October 13, 1917, when the miracle of the sun occurred, she appeared to the 3 children dressed as Our Lady of Mount Carmel, with the Carmelite scapular hanging from her right hand.

One other interesting fact is that the Diocese of Spokane will be having a Rosary crusade next Sunday, July 23rd. Their poster prominently displays Our Lady of Fatima. In a word: wow!

Might I mention, too, that we have a wonderful stained glass window of St. Teresa, foundress of the Carmelites, in St. Anthony's.

A big shout out and word of congratulations to St. Bernard's parish! Each July we have a yard sale. As you know, a lot of work goes into making an event happen. We had another successful year! As a matter of fact, this might have been a record year! What a blessing for the beloved community of St. Bernard's!

## THE SOLEMNITY OF THE CARMELITES.

The word "Carmelite" takes its origin from Mount Carmel, the mountain of the Prophet Elijah, which in the biblical and patristic traditions means fertility, beauty, generosity and wealth of grace. All this, adapted to the spiritual life, is realized in those who embrace the Carmelite contemplative life.

In 1562, Teresa of Jesus began her famous "Teresian" reform with the aim of re-establishing a true Carmelite life for religious women as proposed in the Council of Trent.

The Carmelite cloistered nuns are women who have discovered the absolute value of the Kingdom of God, and wish to realize this in their monasteries, as a praying sisterhood at the service of the Church. They commit themselves to live in intimate union with Jesus, God and man, in order to make present today the plan of God for humankind. They wish to be a visible sign of the union of God with the world.
